BEWARE OF NEONICOTINOIDS

“Neonics” are a group of insecticides used widely around our homes, urban landscapes and farms.

Recent research has shown they are a risk to bees and many other beneficial insects. Even when exposed to low doses of “Neonics” colonies grow slower with impaired ability to navigate or forage for food.

When purchasing plants, ask your local nursery or garden center if plants have been treated with Neonicotinoids.
